

## Fine Doodles Turns Your Child's Pictures into Fine Art

If you're a parent, you know [what it's like to](#) have your fridge covered in drawings and crafts and school assignments. I know that my house is overflowing with my daughters' artwork. I love some of their little drawings, but sometimes they just aren't that durable. My three-year-old, for example, recently drew a fabulous picture of a princess dancing with flowers. It was adorable. Unfortunately, her little sister accidentally spilled her milk all over it. Other pictures have been drawn over the top of or cut up or just lost. If you are a parent of a budding artist, though, you want something longer lasting as a memento of your child at this age and their fantastic artwork.

If this situation sounds familiar to you, then you should definitely check out the company [Fine Doodles](#). This relatively new business is based on a unique and almost absurdly cute concept. You pick a drawing by your child, and send it to Fine Doodles. Then artist Summer Myers "re-imagines" your child's picture. She stays true to their drawing, but turns it into an acrylic painting with vibrant colors and child-like exuberance. It look like your child's picture, but with an added artistic flair. You get a unique painting that is not only a lasting record of your child and their childhood, but also a great piece of artwork for your home. My favorites are from the drawings of younger children.

These obviously appeal to parents. They make a great decoration for your home, and your child will be thrilled to see their picture turned into something recognizable, and yet so grown up. They appeal to me as a gift item. Don't know what to give the grandparents (or great-grandparents) for Christmas, birthdays, etc.? It can be difficult to pick out presents for these people, but a Fine Doodles painting is a unique gift that any grandparent would love.

All of the products are acrylic paintings, but you can choose from a variety of shapes and sizes. It is also possible to order prints of your child's painting. I was pleasantly surprised when I looked at their prices too. A commissioned original piece of art can be expensive, but these start from just \$30 (plus \$5 shipping and handling). Even the "gigantic" size, at 24"x30x

comes to a total of \$145. That seems like a lot, but most family portraits would cost more, and even a framed print ordered from an art shop can cost that much.

If you have kids, this business is definitely worth looking into, especially if you are looking for decoration for your home or need a special gift for a family member. Although artist Summer Myers is based in Washington, Fine Doodles can ship worldwide and it is an internet business. So wherever you are, you can visit them.
